Day 1:

Yangon

Meals: None

Welcome to Myanmar!

On arrival in Yangon International Airport, meet your guide and driver for a private transfer to your hotel. Rest of day is free at your own leisure.

Overnight at Aung Thapyay Hotel, Standard room

Day 2:

Yangon

Meals: B L

After breakfast at your hotel, get ready for a unique spiritual walk around the Shwedagon Pagoda. During this interactive half day tour we take you through the back door and show you the full history of the pagoda, the daily life of all people living in the immediate surroundings of the pagoda and a deeper insight in the Buddhist religion and how the spiritual belief is mixed with the belief in nats – the Myanmar spirits. An intriguing half day tour starting from the bottom of the hill and passing the workshops, markets and monasteries which will be useful or even essential to understand more of the country during the rest of your journey. The tour includes a traditional Burmese breakfast, offerings to monks and the pagoda and a visit to a fortune teller. Afternoon free to discover downtown Yangon with all it's heritage buildings on your own.

Overnight at Aung Thapyay Hotel, Standard room

Day 3:

Yangon – Hsipaw

Meals: B

Breakfast at the hotel. Later in the morning you will transfer to Yangon airport for flight to Lashio around via Mandalay. Arrival in Lashio and transfer to Hsipaw (about 1,5 hour). In the afternoon, departure with guide for a 4 hour walk through a panoramic scenery of paddy fields and other seasonal crops passing small creeks, Shan villages, local schools, the grave of the first prince of Hsipaw, a local nunnery as well as a wooden monastery. The guide will explain in detail about Shan life around Hsipaw and show you some home industries like cheroot (cigar) rolling, bamboo weaving and explain why each Shan village has a spirit house build at the entrance of the village. Don't forget to bring a hat, water and your camera. We will try to visit a local school in the area and teachers are always grateful to receive pens, books etc for the poorest children. Please give presents to teachers only and NOT directly to the children. Return to the hotel early evening.

Day 4:

Hsipaw

Meals: B

After breakfast, the day is free at leisure.

Day 5:

Hsipaw – Kyaukme

Meals: B L

Going local today! The 7.30 local bus will depart opposite the post office (an impressive colonial wooden building); 3 minutes' walk from your hotel. And when we say local we mean local... the bus is stopping at every village to let people or goods in and out and basically functions a bit like the local postman (for letter, packages or big bags of rice). Expect to be surrounded (or sit on top of) vegetables, rice and anything else you can imagine surrounded by local people. Arrive around 8.30 in Kyaukme and get out at the final bus stop right at the market where a local Khiri representative will be waiting for you to bring main luggage to guesthouse and start trekking. During a full day trekking through the mountains surrounding Kyaukme the guide will give you an insight in the life of the Palaung people living in the hills. We have lunch in one of the Palaung villages. A great day out in the nature in an area where you can still find people who have never seen a western foreigner in their life and who live according to century old traditions. Total walking time is about 4-5 hours.

Overnight at A Yone Oo Guesthouse, Standard bungalow

Day 6:

Kyaukme – Mandalay

Meals: B

Breakfast at the guesthouse. Free time to explore the town with its colonial buildings and the busy and colourful market where we suggest you to buy food and drinks for on the train. A 10 minute walk will lead you to the train station. We have reserved seats for you till Pyin Oo Lwin station on the spectacular train crossing the mighty Gokteik Viaduct which was constructed in 1901 by constructors from the Pennsylvania Steel company and was once the second highest railway bridge in the world. The train departs at 11.05 from Kyaukme station and will pass the Gokteik viaduct around 13.30. Through spectacular mountain scenery the train will slowly move forward over the old railway track passing small villages and towns where vendors will enter the train to sell drinks and local snacks. Expected arrival time in the Pyin Oo Lwin – the former summer capital for the British colonial administration – around 16.00, but be warned – there might be delays with an historic railway like this one.

We suggest you to leave at 10:15 or 10:30 toward the Kyaukme train station which is about 10 minutes walk from the guesthouse. Somebody from the guesthouse will walk with you and give you the train ticket. If you don't want to walk you can hire a motorbike taxi with trailer.

Tip: go to the Kyaukme market in the morning and buy water, biscuits, banana etc for your lunch in the train today. Buying a small pillow to sit on could be useful as well as the train has only hard wooden seats. To make sure you get out at the correct station please inform other passengers that you will have to get out at Pyin Oo Lwin station.

Upon arrival, you will be transferred to the hotel in Mandalay by private taxi.

Day 7:**Mandalay**

Meals: B

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel. A fantastic cycling tour just outside the city of Mandalay is ready for you! We start biking from our conveniently located shop and ride through the back lanes to get out of town. We pass through fresh markets, lively neighbourhoods and head for the north east of the city. After only a short pedal we find ourselves in the true countryside where farmers tend to their fields and villagers go about the daily rituals that have remained unchanged for decades, if not longer. Water buffalo lazily roll in the mud, goats nibble at the foliage, and friendly locals wave from all directions. We make some interesting stops, first at a fresh market to learn about the different produce on sale and then continue on to see bamboo weaving which is used to construct everything from roofs and walls to fans. We see a much sought after bean curd being produced and listen to the owner who will have you convinced it is the best quality bean product in the country. We take a walk through a typical central Myanmar village and learn about their way of life and their different crops. On our way back to town we stop at a tea shop for some delicious snacks and tea. We return to our shop at around 11:30/noon and bring you by motorbike back to the hotel. Please note, you should wear clothing suitable for this activity: quarter length pants, shorts, t-shirts are all advisable, as are comfortable closed shoes. Sunscreen is also a must.

The tour includes transfers at 07.15 from your hotel to the starting point and back to your hotel by motorbikes.

Day 8:**Mandalay – Bagan**

Meals: B

After breakfast, transfer to Mandalay bus station to take public bus to Bagan (08.00 – 14.00). Upon arrival at the bus station meet your guide and start sightseeing. A half-day tour by car, with an experienced guide through Bagan will show you the best-known temples of the area. We start the day climbing a pagoda to get a first impressive view over the whole area. From here the guide plans his way to some of the other amazing temples that have been here for hundreds of years. Places like the Ananda, Dhammayangyi, Sulamani, and Thatbyinnyu will certainly impress you.

Day 9:**Bagan**

Meals: B

After breakfast, the day is free at leisure.

Meals: B

Early breakfast at the hotel. This morning transfer to the bus station to take a public bus to Shwe Nyaung (06.00 – 17.00). On arrival at Shwe Nyaung transfer to Nyaung Shwe on own arrangement.

Day 11:

Nyaung Shwe

Meals: B

After breakfast, be ready for a full day excursion on the amazing Inle Lake. Located in the southern Shan State, it is a vast natural lake surrounded by traditional Shan villages. On the lake itself the Intha people have been living for many centuries in village built entirely on stilts on the lake. Today we will take you by private motorboat around the lake to discover the natural beauty of the lake, visit the floating gardens, see some of the famous leg rowers and have some tea at a local family's house. On and around the lake traditional markets are held in different villages according to a 5-day rotating schedule and today we will take you to a colourful market frequented by Shan and PaO people living nearby. We will certainly also visit a local cheroot factory (where the Burmese cigars are made), floating tomato gardens, Phaung Daw Oo Pagoda, Intha Heritage house where the Burmese cats are bred and if wanted we visit a weaving factory. Lunch is included. Return to your hotel late afternoon.

Day 12:

Nyaung Shwe

Meals: B

After breakfast, the day is free at leisure.

Day 13:

Nyaung Shwe – Chiang Rai

Meals: B

Breakfast at the hotel before your transfer to Heho airport for your flight to Tachileik. Arrived at the Tachileik airport and meet your guide and transfer to the Thai border.

Welcome to Thailand!

Meet your Thai guide and driver and transfer to your hotel in Chiang Rai (about 1h drive). Rest of the day is free at leisure to relax after your long journey.

Day 14:

Chiang Rai – Chiang Khong

Meals: B L

After breakfast at your hotel, experience an authentic culinary and cultural discovery walk (*foodie walk*) in the country's far North. As we explore Chiang Rai's tastiest neighborhoods, you will enjoy tasting delicious Thai cuisine and learn about Thai culture and local history. We will walk our way through Chiang Rai's most yummy districts as our knowledgeable tour guides unveil real stories behind each restaurant and their locally famous dish. Along the way, we also share with you about exciting history, exceptional culture, as well as distinctive architecture. The tour includes a variety of mouth-watering food tastings (enough for lunch or dinner), from Thai and ethnic specialty eateries, renowned street food stalls, to historic fine dining restaurants. With so much food to try when you are in Chiang Rai it's difficult to decide where to get started! Let us guide you to best dishes prepared by best chefs in town. We plan, you explore, eat, and enjoy! It's a foodie dream come true. Later this afternoon, transfer to the border town of Chiang Khong (about 2h drive).

Day 15:

Chiang Khong – Pakbeng

Meals: B L

After breakfast you will be transferred to the Thai-Lao Friendship Bridge to proceed with immigration.

Welcome to Laos!

On the Laos side of the bridge, a representative will be waiting for you as you exit Lao Immigration. After processing your visa and completing immigration and customs formalities you will be transferred to the slow boat pier where your boat will be waiting for you. On the way, the boat will take its first stop in Pak Tha, to have the voyage documents signed. The second stop will be to visit a Kamu village along the Mekong River at Ban Houey Phalam. A delicious lunch is served on board. The boat will arrive in Pakbeng in the late afternoon. Upon arrival in Pakbeng, make your own way to your hotel.

Day 16:

Pakbeng – Luang Prabang

Meals: B L

After breakfast walk back to the boat pier and board the Shompoo Cruise for another day of cruising on the Mekong River. At 8.30, the boat leaves Pakbeng. On the way, we will make one stop to visit the famous Pak Ou Caves (Tham Ting) and its thousands of Buddha images. Another savory Lao lunch is served on board. You will arrive in Luang Prabang around 17.00. Meet your driver and transfer to your accommodation.

Day 17:

Luang Prabang

Meals: B

Relax on your own in Luang Prabang.

Optional Tour (Supplement applies)

Meet your guide at your hotel and explore this historic and charming World Heritage Town. Walk to begin your journey at the most popular of temples – Wat Xieng Thong. This 500 year old temple is exquisite and is the best example of the classic Luang Prabang style. From here, explore small side streets, along back alleys and through temples – a city that could have been designed with slow travel in mind, a morning walking tour allows you to soak up the ambiance and appreciate the hidden charms of Luang Prabang. Through your guide, feel free to ask the locals questions as they go about their daily lives. Continue wandering up the peninsula, stopping at temples and other sites as you wish. Visit the National Museum, which is the former Royal Palace. Relics from Laos' royalist past remain here. Overlooking the palace is Phousi Mountain. It is said that those who do not climb the 328 steps up have not really made it to the city. Venture up the hill and be rewarded with remarkable views of the area.

Day 18:

Luang Prabang

Meals: B

Relax on your own in Luang Prabang.

Optional Tour (Supplement applies)

Travel south of town to the Kuang Si Waterfall. Stop along the way to visit the Living Crafts Centre, a place where you can learn about textiles and meet the weavers who help keep these traditions alive. At the falls, crystal water cascades into idyllic turquoise pools. Bring a bathing suit if you would like to swim! Also take time to visit the nearby Sunbear Refuge to learn more about the poaching of these endangered creatures.

Day 19:

Luang Prabang – Vientiane

Meals: B

After breakfast, meet your driver and transfer to the bus station for your VIP bus to Vientiane (approximately 10 hours). On arrival, transfer on your own to your hotel.

Overnight at Vayakorn Inn, Standard room

Day 20:

Vientiane – Pakse

Meals: B

Relax on your own in Vientiane. Late this afternoon, meet your driver and transfer to the bus station for your VIP night bus to Pakse.

Optional Tour (Supplement applies)

Meet your guide and visit some important sites of Vientiane's past and present. Visit Wat Sisaket, which is the only structure to survive the Siamese invasion of 1828 intact. Across the street, sits Ho Pha Keo, reconstructed in the 1930s on the site of the original building. It housed the Emerald Buddha which now lives in Bangkok and is now the home to a fine collection of Lao artistry. A short journey up Lane Xang street allows you a glimpse into the changing face of the city. Amongst the more modern structures is Patouxai, the Lao Victory Monument. Also visit Wat That Luang with its central lotus-bud spire and 30 surrounding stupas - the most sacred structure in all of Laos. Wat Si Muang is a much more vibrant example of living Buddhism. This sacred temple is used by the Lao people for everything, from women trying to become pregnant, to new car owners having monks bless their new purchases. Also pay a visit to the COPE Visitor Centre for a moving insight into the Secret War, which left Laos has the most heavily bombed country in history.

Overnight on board air-conditioned VIP Night Bus

Day 21:

Pakse – Boloven Plateau

Meals: None

On arrival this morning, meet your driver and travel up the Bolaven Plateau. Check-in at your nature resort and free time to relax.

Day 22:

Boloven Plateau – Pakse

Meals: B

Relax on your own on the Bolaven Plateau. In the afternoon, meet your driver and transfer back to Pakse for overnight.

Day 23:**Pakse – Siem Reap**

Meals: B

Relax on your own until time to transfer to the airport for your flight to Siem Reap.

Welcome to Cambodia!

Upon arrival in Siem Reap obtain your Cambodian visa, if you haven't already. Clear Immigration and Customs and proceed into the arrival area. You will meet your private guide and driver for your transferring to check in hotel.

Overnight at Claremont Hotel, Deluxe room

Day 24:**Siem Reap**

Meals: B L

This morning depart the hotel with tuk-tuk for Angkor Wat, the largest and most breathtaking monument at Angkor. Built as the funerary temple for Suryavarman II, who ruled from 1112 to 1152, Angkor never fails to reward the first time or repeat visitor with its grand scale, surreal bas reliefs and unbelievable attention to detail. Here, you will spend the morning exploring one of man's most magnificent creations. Then visit the South Gate of Angkor Thom and the temples of Bayon, Baphoun, Phimean Akas, The Royal Enclosure, the terraces of Elephants and the Leper King. In addition, visit the Bayon temple with its mysterious towers and beautiful bas-reliefs. Enjoy your lunch at Nest restaurant. Next you'll explore Ta Phrom. This jungle-clad temple with overgrown trees exudes a haunting and exotic atmosphere. The magnificent roots of a tree push between the temple's huge stone blocks in a strange embrace. Today you will finish the tour with an unforgettable sunset on one of the special places of Angkor complex has to offer.

Day 25:**Siem Reap**

Meals: B

Free day at your leisure.

Day 26:**Siem Reap – Phnom Penh**

Meals: B L

This morning, your guide and driver will pick you up and transfer you to Phnom Penh. After one hour from Siem Reap traveling, you will reach Kompong Kdei "Naga Bridge" to stop for exploring the ancient bridge. Along the way you will visit Sambor Prei Kuk. The road leading from the main road to the ruins is still unpaved and a bit bumpy at times. Sambor Prei Kuk was the capital of the Chenla Kingdom, which predates Angkor by several centuries. The ruins are spread out over a vast distance. Tourists seldom visit this place so you can enjoy the beautiful ruins in peace and quiet. You will have a traditional Khmer lunch at local restaurant near by the temple. After lunch, you will continue your journey towards the capital, passing through the beautiful Khmer countryside. You continue to Phnom Penh capital and stop at Skun Village to see the spider and go on journey to Phnom Penh directly.

Overnight at Cardamom Hotel, Deluxe room

Day 27:**Phnom Penh**

Meals: B L

After breakfast, pick up for tour of the more remote sights of Phnom Penh with your private guide and driver. Visit reminders of the gruesome days when the Khmer Rouge was in power: Tuol Sleng, the infamous S-21 prison as well as the Killing Fields at Choeng Ek. That the future holds promise is evident with a visit to the Apsara Foundation, which aim is to educate poor Cambodian children to become professional dancers and musicians, and simultaneously conserve Cambodian arts and culture. Lunch will be at the Friends Restaurant, which provides under privileged street children with the opportunity to gain first-hand experience of the hospitality business. Not only is the food delicious but all profits are reinvested into the Training Centre activities. Next, explore some of the main sights, such as the Independence Monument, Royal Palace, the Silver Pagoda and National Museum. Afterwards return to your hotel to spend the evening free at your leisure. We recommend visiting Phnom Penh's charming riverside which is buzzing with activity and has many good restaurants.

Day 28:

Phnom Penh – Can Tho

Meals: B

After hotel check out meet tuk-tuk driver for transfer to the boat pier where you will take the speed boat to Chau Doc. On arrival, proceed with immigration.

Upon arrival, our guide and driver will pick you up at the pier and transfer to Can Tho. Check-in at the hotel and enjoy the rest of the day free at leisure.

Day 29:

Can Tho – Ho Chi Minh City

Meals: B L

After an early breakfast we will board our local boats to visit the Cai Rang Floating Market, the most famous floating market of the Mekong Delta. Enjoy the beautiful scenery and the bustling activity of the market. We will further venture through small canals visiting a rice husking mill and a shop where rice noodles are being produced. Later, we will go back to the hotel for breakfast and we will get ready to continue our trip to Vinh Long. Upon arrival to Vinh Long, board a local boat towards An Binh Island. Explore the maze of small canals and visit a local orchard where you will try fruit and walk around the local handicrafts. Lunch will take place at a local house. After lunch you will ride bicycles to further explore this fertile island. Board a local boat that brings us to Cai be. Transfer to Ho Chi Minh City.

Day 30:

Ho Chi Minh City

Meals: B L

A trip to Sai Gon offers you a good experience of the country's most dynamic city – a vital economic hub with bustling life. Sai Gon is the reconciliation between American and Chinese influence, with many dots of modernity yet without losing Vietnamese traits. Modern office skyscrapers, amidst Chinese style pagodas and food stalls, street vendors along the street, they all create a dynamic urban area in a very traditionally modern sense. In the morning, you will start the trip by heading to China Town and visit Binh Tay Market, stop over at Thien Hau, a 150 year old Chinese Temple, followed by the remarkable sites of the War Remnants Museum. Lunch will take place at a local restaurant. In the afternoon, you will visit the Reunification Palace -former residence of the presidents of South Vietnam before 1975-, followed by an

exploration of the Notre Dame Cathedral and the historic Central Post Office. End the trip with a visit to Ben Thanh Market: time for shopping.

Day 31:

Ho Chi Minh City – Hoi An

Meals: B

After breakfast, free time until your transfer to the airport for your flight to Da Nang. Upon arrival, meet your driver and head towards your hotel in Hoi An. Check-in and enjoy the rest of the evening free at leisure.

Day 32:

Hoi An

Meals: B

Free day at leisure.

Optional

Today we will start a walking tour through this charming small town made of hundreds of historic houses, congregation halls, pagodas and other structures. Its buildings and its streets reflect the indigenous and foreign influences this town had, defining it as a unique heritage and multi-cultural site. There's plenty to see in this delightful town, such as the Japanese Covered Bridges, the Pottery Museum, the 200 years old Tan Ky House, Chua Ong Pagoda and the vibrant local market. We will visit all of them in this walking tour. In the evening you will have free time at leisure to relax and discover this beautiful town on your own.

Day 33:

Hoi An – Hanoi

Meals: B

Enjoy the morning free at leisure until your driver picks you up and transfer you to Da Nang Airport for your flight to Ha Noi. Upon arrival to Ha Noi, meet your driver and head to your hotel. Check-in and enjoy the rest of the evening free at leisure.

Day 34:

Hanoi

Meals: B

Meet your guide and driver and head towards Hoan Kiem Lake. It is a cultural thing in Vietnam to wake up very early (6am) and start the morning with some exercise. It is very interesting to see how the local people, mostly women from varying age, start their busy routine. Several groups of people can be found practicing tai chi and aerobics. Be part of Vietnam and join the locals in their morning routine! After having a Vietnamese Iced coffee -Café sua da-, you will start a walking tour where you will be able to witness the French architecture in different Vietnamese buildings. We will also visit some typical communal houses which have been restored by UNESCO. Vietnam is very well known for its food, so a stop to try some specialties is a must. In the old quarter you will try Pho Bo (Hanoi's excellent beef noodle soup), Nom (green papaya salad with seasoned beef), Banh Goi (Pillow-shaped pastry with minced pork and mushroom), Banh Cuon (hot rice paper with pork and fried onion) or Bun Cha (fresh noodle with grilled pork). After our super local lunch, we will visit the Temple of Literature, built in 1076.

Vietnam's first university was established within this temple to educate Vietnam's royalty, mandarins and members of the elite. The university functioned for 700 years and its gardens and well-preserved architecture offer a fascinating glimpse into Vietnam's past. After the temple of literature, we will head to Quan Thanh Temple, a Taoist Temple dated from the 11th Century and ending with the impressive Tran Quoc Pagoda, a Buddhist pagoda located in a small island in the center of the West Lake. Our day will finish with evening beers at the typical and well known Bia Hoi, where you will taste local draft beer.

Day 35:

Hanoi

Meals: B

Free day at leisure.

Optional (2 days)

After breakfast, you will be picked up from your hotel to Ha Long Bay, one of the most spectacular UNESCO World Heritage Areas and the world's largest marine limestone 'karts' landscape. After a 3.5h drive towards North East of Hanoi, you will arrive at Tuan Chau International Marina on the harbour of Ha Long's biggest island. From here a boat will take you to our Halong Phoenix Cruiser. A refreshing welcome drink will be served and you can check into your cabin. As you settle into your cabin, the boat will set sail to the center of this World Heritage site. Lunch will be served in the restaurant while you enjoy the amazing scenery. From the marina area, our cruiser will sail by Dog Head and Swan Islands, Ba Hang Floating villages (with floating houses), Incense Burner and Thumb Islands before reaching the Luom Bo area for kayaking. Around 3pm, we have time to gear up for one hour of kayaking around Luom Bo area (the provincial border between Quang Ninh province and Cat Ba National Park of Hai Phong). As the sun sets over the bay, we head back to the cruise and relax. Dinner will be served with local seafood and then you can choose to enjoy a drink from the bar or experience squid fishing, before going to bed.

Day 36:

Hanoi

Meals: B

Free day at leisure.

Optional (2 days)

After breakfast you will visit an impressive grotto of Ha Long Bay – Surprising (Sung Sot) Cave, with your guide. When you return to the Ha Long Phoenix cruiser to begin your return journey to the harbor and experience viewing other areas and islands of Ha Long Bay, a cooking demonstration onboard will show you how to make authentic Vietnamese spring rolls. You will learn about the recipes and the techniques to create this popular Vietnamese dish. Lunch will be served on the boat as you near the harbor. At noon; you will get back to the marina where your shuttle bus will be waiting you to take you back to your hotel in Hanoi.

Hanoi – Koh Samet

Meals: B
